

New Hampshire's "I Am College Bound/I Applied" campaign is designed to encourage high school seniors to pursue post-secondary education and to assist them in navigating the college admission process by inviting them to submit at least one college admission application during a specified school day with the support of their school counseling office and local higher education professionals.

This campaign is part of the American Council on Education's <u>American</u> <u>College Application Campaign (ACAC)</u>, a national effort to increase the number of first-generation and low-income students pursuing a college degree or other higher education credential.

High schools are invited to participate in the "I Am College Bound/I Applied campaign based upon a combination of documented higher-than-state average free and reduced lunch population for high school students, as well as a lower-than-state average college-going rate. While special focus is placed upon assisting students who would be the first in their families to attend college and students who may not have otherwise seriously considered attending college, each eligible senior at participating high schools is encouraged to take part in the event.

In 2018, this campaign was held from November 13 through November 30 and for the second year in a row, all New Hampshire colleges and universities offered free college applications to the students at the 42 participating public high schools during their school's event. Participating students benefitted from an estimated \$127,000 in waived college application fees (this does not include any existing free applications used by any of the state's colleges and universities). Additionally, each participating high school receives one \$500 scholarship to be raffled and awarded to a participating student.

Looking Ahead:

Follow-up materials regarding completing the college admissions and financial aid processes were provided to participating students at each school's event, and students who opted in for additional electronic communications have been subscribed to The NHHEAF Network Organizations' Varsity Letter monthly e-newsletter to re-inforce the key next steps in the college admissions, financial aid and private scholarship processes.

It is our hope to continue to build the "I Am College Bound" brand across the state of New Hampshire. In addition to "I Am College Bound/I Applied", we will further our work to create campaigns and initiatives around "I Am College Bound/I Filed" to support FAFSA-filing efforts and "I Am College Bound/I Decided" to support decision day activities for all high school seniors. These three initiatives align with other national efforts to recognize these milestones for high school seniors.

Admissions offices at New Hampshire colleges and universities have been provided the names of participating students in this program who have applied to their institution for follow-up and hopefully, quick notification of college acceptances.

Many high schools immediately awarded their \$500 scholarship to participating students after their school's event. Other high schools will award their scholarships during their awards ceremony in the Spring.

Tracking students to college enrollment after high school graduation is imperative to the success of this initiative and requires the support of the New Hampshire Department of Education and the use of the National Clearinghouse Data they receive.

"I Am College Bound/I Applied" will continue to expand in 2019 to include the participation of five (5) to seven (7) additional New Hampshire public high schools. To allow for this expansion, our "I Am College Bound/I Applied" events are expected to take place throughout the month of November in 2019. It is our goal to have all high schools, public and private, participate in "I Am College Bound/I Applied" by 2025.


The NHHEAF Network Organizations' college counselor (and Concord High School alum) Cam led this year's program at his alma mater!
