

DATA COLLECTION PURPOSE & EXAMPLE SIGN IN/OUT SHEET

To effectively address the grant needs and ensure the initiative's success, implementing pre and post-surveys is crucial. These surveys serve as invaluable tools for gauging the impact of events designed to assist students in their senior year and inform the state application campaign and the American College Application Campaign (ACAC). The pre-survey aims to establish a baseline understanding of students' awareness, confidence, and intentions regarding the college application process. On the other hand, the post-survey aims to assess the effectiveness of the events by capturing shifts in attitudes, knowledge, and preparedness among participating juniors. This data, collected without including any personally identifiable information (PII), will provide essential insights for grant reporting, demonstrating the initiative's outcomes, and informing future strategies to enhance student support during this critical phase of their academic journey.

SURVEY BEFORE EVENTS

DATA TO INCLUDE

Number of Juniors

Obtain a count of the total number of junior students in the given cohort.

Number of Juniors Who Participated

Identify and record the number of juniors who actively engaged in the pre-event activities.

Number of Juniors Who Created a List of Postsecondary Institutions

Determine how many juniors took the initiative to compile a list of potential postsecondary institutions. Emphasize that it's acceptable if the list is not finalized, as the goal is to encourage initial exploration.

→ SURVEY AFTER EVENTS

DATA TO INCLUDE

Number of Juniors Who Participated:

Reassess the number of juniors who actively participated post-event to gauge the impact and retention of student engagement.

Number of Juniors Who Created a List of Postsecondary Institutions:

Determine the number of students who, after the event, have completed their list of postsecondary institutions or made progress on it.

→ SHARE RESULTS WITH STATE CAMPAIGN AND ACAC

By collecting and analyzing this information, the state application campaign and the American College Application Campaign (ACAC) can make informed decisions and improvements to support students in their senior year better and enhance the overall effectiveness of the program.

SURVEY RESULTS SHOULD

- Summarize and anonymize the collected data, ensuring the removal of any PII.
- Provide a comprehensive report on the:
- Percentage of juniors who participated in the events.
- Trends and insights from the pre and post-event surveys.
- Observations on the impact of the events on students' preparedness for the college application process.
